ABOUT PIMSA

In 2003, the Health Initiative of the Americas (previously known as California-Mexico Health Initiative), in partnership with key Mexican institutions and programs from the University of California launched its first call for research proposals on Migration and Health, focusing on Mexican immigrants in California.

In 2006, the funding committee (made up of primary contributors) renamed this effort *Programa de Investigación en Migración y Salud* (PIMSA) and expanded participation to other academic institutions in the United States. PIMSA funds **binational research teams** whose research proposals focus on migration and health within current policy contexts. A total of 51 binational projects have been funded to date. Both preliminary and final results of these projects have been presented in public policy forums attended by academic researchers, stakeholders and policy makers from both countries. Many of these projects have subsequently obtained follow-up funding to continue their research. The results of these projects have been disseminated as public policy documents directed to decision-makers and the media.

OBJECTIVES

PIMSA is administered jointly by the Health Initiative of the Americas (HIA) and the California Program on Access to Care (CPAC) under the auspices of the University of

RESEARCH PRIORITY AREAS

Researchers should cover the context of migration along with the health impact and the social determinants of health and should focus their research questions on the projected impact on public policies. The projects should have binational results and recommendations. The following are research areas which will be given priority:

- Mental health, including domestic violence, alcohol and substance abuse, and its relation with culture;
- Chronic diseases, including nutrition related conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, high cholesterol, and obesity;
- 3. **Infectious diseases**, including HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, hepatitis, and sexually transmitted infections (STIs);
- Occupational health and injury prevention, especially concerning farm workers;
- Women's health:
- Special vulnerable populations (indigenous, disabled, elderly);
- 7. Access to services, including best practices for health prevention and promotion, such as *promotoras* outreach programs; strategies for expanding health insurance; legal aspect of access to health; and the use of medical technology to reduce health disparities.

California Berkeley, School of Public Health. This cycle will be open to researchers from the any of the University of California campuses, University of Arizona, University of New Mexico, University of Texas at El Paso, Texas A & M University, University of Illinois at Chicago, State University of New York, and all California State University campuses, working in collaboration with researchers from CONACYT-accredited institutions in all Mexican states. PIMSA has four primary goals:

- Provide grants to binational teams of researches for period of up to 12 months to conduct research on migration and health between Mexico and the United States;
- Translate research results into public policy recommendations and present these recommendations as policy briefs in public forums to inform advocates and decision makers on issues related to health and migration.
- Publish research findings in international peer-reviewed journals; and
- Provide funds for developing and completing previously funded projects from different sources that will contribute to the knowledge base of migration and health-related issues facing Mexican-origin workers and their families in the U.S. and Mexico.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Collaborations: Funded projects are expected to lead to the development of long-term collaborations while strengthening academic and research capabilities of the participating institutions in Mexico and the United States.
- Sustainability: Grant recipients are encouraged to seek matching sources of support and to use the PIMSA "seed" funds to undertake the preliminary research necessary to develop proposals for other extramural funding.
- **Policy-relevance**: It is expected that there will be a significant advancement of health policy research as it relates to public service and education programs that address critical issues related to health and migration in the U.S. and Mexico.
- Publications: Results and recommendations will be published as policy papers or working papers that will be disseminated broadly in the policy and academic arenas. It is required that the binational research teams submit manuscripts from this RFP to institutional peer-reviewed journals.

TYPES OF GRANTS

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP)

Grants given under this cycle are considered "seed" grants and are expected to be used as a basis for leveraging future funding from other sources. Research projects may examine current and anticipated policies in their respective areas. PIMSA encourages collaborative and interdisciplinary projects. Individual grant amounts are limited to \$45,000. Principals Investigators (PIs) will be notified of the terms and conditions of their awards. Projects are normally funded for a period of up to a maximum of 12 months. Note: No Cost Extensions can be requested. PIMSA also encourages investigators to secure outside funding to supplement research. To apply, fill out forms on pages 6-11.

DISSERTATION AND FELLOWSHIP GRANTS

Graduate student dissertation grants and post-doctoral fellowship grants are intended to provide support for short-term research projects. Such awards do not require a binational team, but do require a binational topic about migration and health issues. Requests for dissertation and fellowship grants are limited to \$5,000. Such awards will be made throughout the year. Students must have approval of the student's advisor or research professor, and academic standing must be certified by the Graduate Division in which the student resides and must follow the procedures established by each campus. Topics should relate to PIMSA Research Priority Areas. To apply, fill out the forms on pages 12-15.

Note: Masters' students can not apply for these grants.

HOW TO APPLY FOR THE RFP

Proposals must be submitted **jointly** by eligible Principal Investigators in the United States and Mexico, using the appropriate forms included in this RFP packet. **No full proposal will be accepted without the prior submission of the Letter of Intent (LOI).** The LOI is due June 12th, 2009 in the form of an e-mail to Rosario. Alberro@berkeley.edu with the subject "PIMSA 2009 LOI". The LOI must include a tentative title, the names of the PIs, and a 200 word abstract including a budget description. PIMSA will notify the PI by June 19th of the approval to submit the full proposal. Each Letter of Intent is reviewed to identify projects having the greatest potential for fulfilling PIMSA's objectives.

Each collaborator is responsible for securing all appropriate approvals at his or her home institution prior to submitting the full proposal. Pls in the United States should contact their campus research office or contracts and grants administrative offices before the published proposal deadline to determine if earlier institutional deadlines exist. Mexican Investigators should consult with the office responsible for approval of proposals in order to obtain the endorsement of their institution's legal contracting authority. The approval process at each PI's home institution should be undertaken before PIMSA's deadline to ensure on-time receipt of the proposal.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A DISSERTATION OR FELLOWSHIP GRANT

Students applying must be advanced to Ph.D. Candidacy to be eligible for a dissertation grant or have their Ph.D. to be eligible for a post-doctoral fellowship grant. No full proposal will be accepted without the prior submission of a Letter of Intent. The LOI is due June 12th, 2009 in the form of an e-mail to Rosario.Alberro@berkeley.edu with the subject "PIMSA 2009 DISSERTATION/FELLOWSHIP LOI". The LOI must include a tentative title, the name of the student, and a 200 word abstract including a budget description. PIMSA will notify the student by June 19th of the approval to submit the full proposal. Each Letter of Intent is reviewed to identify projects having the greatest potential for fulfilling PIMSA's objectives.

ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA FOR RFP

Each proposal must be co-directed by an eligible U.S. PI <u>and</u> a PI from a Mexican academic or research institution. High priority will be given to projects that are interdisciplinary.

• Eligibility of Principal Investigators from the United States

This grant cycle is open to PIs from the University of California, University of Arizona, University of New Mexico, University of Texas at El Paso, Texas A & M University, University of Illinois at Chicago, State University of New York, and California State University. Pls must meet eligibility criteria specified by their respective universities.

• Eligibility of Principal Investigators from Mexico

Principal Investigators from Mexican institutions must meet eligibility criteria set forth by CONACYT, which specify that they must hold full time academic/research appointments in a Mexican institution of higher education and/or conduct research that is part of the *Registro Nacional de Instituciones y Empresas Científicas y Tecnológicas* (RENIECYT) referred to in article 25, section II of the Law of Science and Tecnology (LCYT). Mexican PIs must be members of the National System of Researchers (SNI).

Researchers (including graduate students and U.S. postdoctoral researchers) who otherwise do not meet the requirements above should develop <u>collaborative ties with eligible PIs and join</u> proposed projects as additional academic participants. PIs are encouraged to collaborate with additional participants from institutions other than their own.

Pls may submit only one proposal for competition. Funding can be provided for the continuation of previously funded grants that have already been completed from external funds. Pls that currently have another active, uncompleted PIMSA grant are ineligible to apply.

Review Process and Selection Criteria

Proposals will be peer-reviewed by a binational panel of academic and policy experts using the following criteria:

- Appropriateness of research design and methodology;
- The investigators' and team's capability to undertake the project;
- Potential impact of findings on the analysis, development, or implementation of health policies in their respective areas:
- The project's potential contribution to the knowledge base underlying particular health policies.

Final funding decisions on all proposals will be made by the funding committee composed of the primary conveners, and announced no earlier than November 27, 2009.

INFORMATION ON FINDING RESEARCH COLLABORATORS IN MEXICO AND THE UNITED STATES

Research Network on International Migration and Health (REMIS, acronym in Spanish)

The Research Network on International Migration and Health is co-directed by the National Public Health Institute of Mexico and the Health Initiative of the Americas. The mission of the network is to improve the health of migrants and their families through research, collaboration, dissemination, and interdisciplinary dialogue.

REMIS may be able to help individual researchers find a Mexican or U.S. colleague interested in participating in a research project. Please send a message to Rosario.Alberro@berkeley.edu with the project's topic and desired researcher's profile.

The Health Initiative of the Americas has also developed a Binational Directory of Researchers in Migration and Health. The directory is divided into areas of research vital to migrant health and is intended to promote collaboration between members of the research community on both sides of the border. ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA FOR DISSERTATION OR FELLOWSHIP GRANTS

Students applying must be advanced to Ph.D. Candidacy for a dissertation grant or have their Ph.D. for a post-doctoral fellowship grant by the time of the submission deadline.

• Eliaibility of Ph.D. Students from the U.S.

This grant cycle is open to PhD students from participating universities. Students must meet eligibility criteria specified by their respective universities.

• Eligibility of Ph.D. Students from Mexico

PhD students from Mexican institutions accredited by CONACYT (Registro Nacional de Instituciones y Empresas Cientificas y Tecnológicas), and advisors must be members of the National System of Researchers (SNI).

BUDGETS FOR RFP

Grant awards for RFP are limited to \$45,000 for a period of 12 months. Requests for continuation of previously funded projects by other agencies that have already been completed may request a smaller budget. If funds are to be expended at both the U.S. and Mexican institutions, the budget must specify the planned distribution of costs and funds at each institution. Allowable expenses include:

- Student research assistance and/or a non-faculty researcher affiliated with the participating universities;
- Data collection expenses, including field and archival research;

- Domestic and international travel including transportation, lodging, and meal expenses for the purpose of
 meetings for project planning, collaborative research, and training; (At least one meeting per year between the
 Co-Pls and/or among the collaborating research teams is encouraged, and one meeting where both Pls must
 be available to present a mid-point progress report or final results is required —this meeting usually takes
 place during the Binational Policy Forum on Migration and Health organized by HIA in the month of October);
- Up to \$500 can be used for supplies and services, including computer related supplies such as software;
- Subcontracts to institutions of additional academic participants not eligible as Principal Investigators.

Items that will NOT be approved include:

- Salary payments to Principal Investigators or any other academic salaries, except student research assistants and/or a non-faculty researcher affiliated with the university;
- Equipment purchases in excess of \$500 per item, including computers, computer parts, and accessories;
- Promotional materials or publication costs; and
- Indirect costs or institutional overhead assessments.

CONDITIONS OF AWARDS AND FINAL REPORTS

Each grant is expected to result in the completion of the proposed work within the project period, and final narrative and financial reports must be submitted jointly by both PIs. The support of the Health Initiative of the Americas and the PIMSA consortium shall be acknowledged in proposals, publications, conference materials, exhibitions, videotapes, or other products of the grants. A copy of all results and end product must be provided to HIA as the Office of Record for this program.

PIs are required to submit a written report of up to 10,000 words by the project end date and a 1,500 word document prepared for a policy audience. Both documents must be in English and Spanish. Investigators may be asked to meet with state officials and/or participate in policy briefings to discuss the implications of their work. It is also expected that PI's may be available to participate in policy brief trainings in order to help the preparation of policy recommendations. A final financial report will be required ninety (90) days after the project end date. PI's are eligible to request a "No Cost Extension" without exceeding 6 months. HIA might request researchers to provide study results for a period of up to three years following grant deadline. HIA should also receive a copy of final manuscripts submitted to peer review journal, and if they are published, a copy of the article should be mailed/emailed to HIA's office.

ADMINSTRATION OF AWARDS

For this cycle, all funds will be administered by the Health Initiative of the Americas, in accordance with University of California policies and procedures and in observance of the PIs' campus or institutional requirements. The portion of the grant awarded to PIs within the UC system will be transferred directly to the academic department at the respective campus. The portion of the grant awarded to non-UC entities, as well as PIs in Mexico, will be transferred directly to respective institution under mutually agreed terms.

Each PI is responsible for accurate and appropriate administration of funds, accounting of expenditures, and completion of accurate and timely financial reports. No indirect cost or overhead cost will be covered by this program. PIs are equally responsible for preparation of required final narrative reports, and for acknowledgment of PIMSA support in written products resulting from the grant. Final reports and accounting of funds are to be submitted jointly by both Co-PIs within the established deadlines to HIA as the Office of Record for the program.


